Inventory of the property
of the late Mr. Thomas Edel,
in his lifetime Tavern
Keeper in this Island, de-
ceased in this town of Gu-
stavia on the fourth of
this instant month of
December in the year one
thousand eight hundred
and twenty one; which
inventory was taken at
the request of the Council
of deceased Mr. David A.
Cohen, inhabitant and
Watchmaker of this place,
assisted by Mr. Charles W.
Therstedt - and in presence
of Mrs. Cohen. Messrs James
Charlotte and Richard Stuf-
field, ^{both} Representatives for
the town of Gustavia, as
Appraisers, M. German and
John Williams Potter, as wit-
nesses

The official seals of the undersigned v. Justice having at the request of Mr. Cohen been put on a large chest, two small trunks and a writing desk of deceased, which being now examined were found safe and untouched and was first opened the writing desk in which was found a will of the deceased, signed before George Graebe Esq. Secretary for the Island of St. Eustatius the eighteenth of September in the year one thousand eight hundred and sixteen, by which last, will or Testament, the deceased has bequeathed two hundred dollars to the poor of the last mentioned island and for the rest

has deputed and nominated his said Executor Mr. David Hobbs and vessel bound to all the residue of the property and sole Executor of the Will -
